### Inspiration/Pledge of Allegiance - Northwest High School

Brody Crowder, a senior at Northwest High, gave the inspiration. He described why he was inspired by the girls' volleyball team of which he is the manager. He said they had in common a desire to win, shared the same goals, and worked as a team. He added the team had greatly improved from the beginning of the year, were focused and determined. Brody then led the Pledge of Allegiance.

### Instructional Report - Northwest High School

Dusty Brown, assistant superintendent for teaching and learning, introduced Britt Adams, principal of Northwest High School to present the instructional report. Mr. Adams said the staff members were coming together as a team. He quoted Bill Gates who said, "Change is inevitable. You can drive it or adapt to it". He said they were doing things at Northwest a little differently. Mr. Adams remarked that test scores were just one indicator that is being used to determine how to move forward. He said the graduation rate last year was 86.3% and that the End of Course Tests was above state average as well as the SAT scores. He strongly emphasized it was all about the journey and shared his excitement about how the students were taking ideas and creating something new they could be proud of. Mr. Adams informed the board members that Northwest was a little behind in technology but added plans were underway to improve in that area. He said there was a grassroots movement to do things differently. He ended by saying the goal should be to get close to the vision but that you should never be satisfied.

#### **School Council Report**

Ann MacKinnon, a teacher at Northwest High School and a school council member, gave the board an update on the school council. She shared that Mike Ewton, safety and security director, had joined the council for a meeting to discuss safety issues. Items discussed by the school council during their meetings were AYP, testing, budget shortfalls, technology, fundraisers, and parent concerns.

### **Archway Partnership**

Melissa Lu, director of the Archway Partnership, described the process involved in creating a vision for the Dalton-Whitfield community which was scheduled to be presented at a public forum on October 26, 2010. She asked the board for their endorsement, participation, and leadership. She presented a handout and discussed how the community vision focuses on the following areas:

- A stable economy with industry diversification focused on current and potentially available resources.
- •Enhanced educational services through the development of our strengths Dalton State College, the public school systems, and technical education and improvement upon our weaknesses.
- •An aesthetically pleasing environment comprised of a vibrant downtown area, parks and greenways, and interconnected trails throughout the community. She added to achieve the goals it was decided the following was needed:

Superintendent Hayes thanked Ms. Lu for her leadership and added it was exciting for Dalton and Whitfield County to be on the way to putting the vision into action.

DD plans and specifications for these additions and renovations have been submitted to the Georgia Department of Education for approval. The first FF&E meeting was held on September 17, 2010 to review package requirements for classrooms, project labs, media center, cafeteria, band, chorus, and miscellaneous areas for Coahulla Creek High School. He also gave the construction status on Coahulla Creek High School.

#### Instructional Report – Varnell Elementary

Lisa Jones, principal of Varnell Elementary, said out of the box things were going on at Varnell. The school design team produced a video to show and describe the great things happening at the school. The video described students as agriculturists, architects, actors, artists, authors, designers, environmentalists, innovators, technology savvy, and winners. Teachers were described as coaches, friends, facilitators, learners, directors, entertainers, helping hands, nurturers, financial advisors, chefs, and family. # **Teaching and Learning Reports and Recommendations**

Introduction of the Pre-K Chinese Teachers

Dusty Brown, assistant superintendent of teaching and learning, introduced Caroline Woodason. Mrs. Woodason is a part of teaching and learning, professional development, and the Pre-K program. She introduced four exchange teachers who are a part of the Confucius Institute at Kennesaw State University. She said they are co-teaching in Pre-K classrooms at Antioch and Cedar Ridge Elementary. The teachers teach the character of the language through songs and language. The teachers introduced themselves and gave both their Chinese names and their American names. They described how they love the students and are pleased to work with the teachers. One of the teachers described how many of the students could already count from 1-10 in Chinese.

Board Member Thomas Barton said he thought it was great how the Whitfield County students were being exposed to another culture.

Mr. Hayes added that the teachers were certified teachers in China. He thanked Dusty Brown and Caroline Woodason for hosting these teachers and described how a support group had been set up to assist the teachers.

# Career, Technical, Agricultural, Education Budget

Phillip Brown, principal of Coahulla Creek High School, informed the board about the budget and intent of use for the Perkins IV Program Improvement fund allocation. Mr. Hayes explained that these funds were flow-through funds and recommended the board approve the request. Jerry Nealey moved approval and Gary Brock seconded. The board approved 5-0.

#### **Operations Reports and Recommendations**

### Construction Update

Keith Burran with M.B. Kahn Construction Management Company updated the board about the progress of the Coahulla Creek High School. He said the football field was on grade and that the athletic sports lighting should be in place in three weeks. He added the site lighting was in place. He informed the board the sheetrock placement was progressing and the school should be in the dry the middle of October. He said he was pleased with the progress of the architects for the Eastbrook Middle design and that it was still progressing on schedule.

# Capital Outlay Project Application

Richard Schoen, assistant superintendent of operations, informed the board that the Whitfield County School System had been pre-approved for the amount of \$6,546,435 from the State of Georgia to be applied to the Eastbrook Middle project. He added the school system had been able to increase the scope of the Eastbrook project because of money saved from the other SPLOST projects. Mr. Trew remarked the school system should be able to fix it right. Mr. Hayes recommended the board approve the Capital Outlay Program Application. Gary Brock moved approval and Thomas Barton seconded. The board approved 5-0.

Kenny Sheppard, chief financial officer, presented the General Fund information to the board as of August 31, 2010. Mr. Hayes recommended the board approve the General Fund report as presented. ## **ESPLOST Reports**

Mr. Sheppard also presented to the board a summary capital projects report. The superintendent recommended the board approve the ESPLOST report as presented. Gary Brock moved approval and Jerry Nealey seconded. The board approved 5-0. This report is a part of these minutes.

### Approval of Millage Rate

Mr. Hayes recommended the board approve to hold the millage rate at 14.756. Jerry Nealey moved approval and Gary Brock seconded. Mr. Trew said it comes to times like this that in today's world it would make it easier and better if you raised taxes, but the heart of the board feels the property tax owners are paying their fair share. He added the state government is not paying their share and that a tax increase is not appropriate in this economy. He applauded the board for the decision and added the district continues to make great gains even in this economy. The board approved 5-0.

# Automated Check Recovery Agreement

Mr. Sheppard said this agreement with Checkredi would replace the agreement the system had with FARS. Mr. Hayes recommended the board approve the agreement with Checkredi. Thomas Barton moved approval and John Thomas seconded. The board approved 5-0.

## **Human Resources Reports and Recommendations**

### Personnel Recommendations

The superintendent recommended the board approve the personnel actions as discussed in executive session to include certified personnel changes, resignations, retirements, leaves of absences, long term substitutes, extended day and other personnel changes. The superintendent also recommended the board approve support personnel recommendations, resignations, retirements, and other support personnel changes in this action. John Thomas moved approval and Jerry Nealey seconded. The board approved 5-0.

# Coahulla Creek High Mascot & School Colors

Phillip Brown presented the board with the new school colors and a preliminary drawing of the school mascot. He described the process on how the school colors and mascot were decided. A group of students who would be attending the new school made the selection. Mr. Brown said they looked at different colors on shirts, cups, and so on before making the selection. There were 1408 responses with suggestions online as well. Navy blue and silver with white were the colors chosen for Coahulla Creek High School. The mascot selection was narrowed down to four choices; Spartans, Coyotes, Colts, and the Cowboys. Colts was the mascot that was selected. Mr. Trew said he was excited about the selection.

# Georgia School Boards Association Partnership Commendation

The superintendent recommended the board approve the name chosen to be awarded the Georgia School Boards Association Partnership Commendation. The commendation will be awarded at a future board meeting. Gary Brock moved approval and Jerry Nealey seconded. The board approved 5-0.
