#### **Recognitions and Presentations**

### **Duke TIP Honorees**

Shanda Hickman, Gifted Coordinator for middle and high school, shared some information about Duke TIP and how the students are chosen to participate. She said that the Duke University Talent Identification Program identifies gifted students and helps them reach their highest potential. Shanda said the 7<sup>th</sup> Grade Talent Search offers qualifying seventh grade students the opportunity to take the SAT or ACT alongside high school students. 7<sup>th</sup> grade students with strong intellectual abilities are invited to participate if they achieve a qualifying score at or above the 95<sup>th</sup> percentile on a recent grade-level test. Depending on their score they can then participate in the summer studies that are offered. Students who are among the top 5 percent academically can attend The Duke TIP Academy for Summer Studies. She said that we had three students attend this summer. Shanda said that students who qualify for the Center for Summer Studies are the highest-scoring students in Duke Tip's 7<sup>th</sup> Grade Talent Search. She said that we had two students attend this summer. These students will be able to attend these summer programs every year until they graduate if all financial requirements are met. Shanda said that she is very proud of each of these students.
